**REDBIRD MOVES THE MIGRATION FLIGHT TRAINING CONFERENCE TO WINTER, ANNOUNCES DATES AND LOCATION FOR 2022**

The company's eleventh Migration event will take place on February 8-9, 2022, at the Aerospace Center for Excellence campus in Lakeland, Florida.

Oshkosh, WI (July 26, 2021) – Redbird Flight Simulations (Redbird) today announced a scheduling change for its popular Migration Flight Training Conference (Migration), an annual gathering of flight training professionals focused on solutions to the real-world problems facing their businesses and organizations. The conference, which the company previously hosted in October, will now take place in the first quarter of each year.

“As we weighed our options for the event at the end of 2021, we determined it was in the best interest of Migration right now and moving forward to hold the conference at the beginning of the year,” said Redbird COO Charlie Gregoire. “We have discussed this possibility for a while based on the feedback we have received from attendees, and we think now is the opportune time to act on it.”

The next Migration Flight Training Conference will occur on February 8-9, 2022, at the Dean and Liz Ramos Innovation Center on the Aerospace Center for Excellence campus in Lakeland, Florida. The conference will feature a full slate of breakout sessions tailored to meet the goals of attendees and keynote presentations from a wide range of industry leaders, including FlightAware Founder and CEO Daniel Baker and Cirrus Aircraft President, Customer Experience Todd Simmons.

With the scheduling change, Redbird will preview new products and initiatives at the conference before the company announces them later in the year. This year, Redbird launched its first annual State of Flight Training Survey and Report, a comprehensive resource developed to take the pulse of the flight training industry and provide flight training professionals with strategic data about it. Redbird will conduct the survey in January of each year and present initial insights from the results at Migration before it releases the official report in March.

By moving the event to the first quarter of the year, Redbird also aims to reduce scheduling conflicts with other aviation events to accommodate the schedules of its attendees and allow more flight training professionals to participate. Following a successful 2020 event, which the company hosted online, Redbird plans to incorporate a virtual experience into Migration moving forward. Flight training professionals who cannot attend the event in person can download the Migration app to tune in to speaking sessions and network with their peers remotely.
